Subject, MOVEMENTS OF DUBLIN EXTREMISTS.

I beg to report that on the 2nd inst. the undermentioned extremists were observed moving about and associating with each other as follows:

With Thomas J. Clarke, 75 Parnell Street, Thomas Byrne and William O'Leary Curtis for half an hour between 1 and 2 p.m.; John T. Kelly, T.C., for twenty minutes between 4 and 5 p.m.; Arthur Griffith for an hour from 10.40 p.m.

Major John McBride, Thomas J. Clarke, John T. Kelly, T.C., William Mellows, Joseph McGuinness, Rev. F. Pollard at Police Court re John McDermott and John Milroy appearing before Magistrate as defendants under Defence of the Realm Act.

M. J. O'Rahilly at Green Street Courthouse from 12 noon until 12.30 p.m. apparently interested in the trial of <sup>? McDermott & Milroy</sup> Hegarty and Bolger; P.O'Keefe and C Collins, G.P.O., leaving Green St. together at 3.40 p.m.

Bulmer Hobson, Thomas McDonagh, P. Beasley, E. Kent, J. Fitzgibbon, P. Ryan, C. Colbert, and L. Moran together in Volunteer Office, 2 Dawson Str together for an hour from 8 p.m.

Thirty four members of the Sinn Fein Volunteers without rifles assembled at 25 Parnell Square at 8.30 p.m. and afterwards in charge of J. O'Connor went route marching in the direction

direction of Fairview. They returned at 10.30 p.m. and dismissed without further parade.

J.J. Walsh left 37 Haddington Road at 11.30 a.m. and walked to the City. He called on James Whelan, 17 Ormond Quay, and later visited in company of Whelan the Gaelic Press, 30 Upper Liffey Street. Walsh then returned to his lodgings which he reached at 2.40 p.m. At 3.15 p.m. he was again seen to leave and walk towards the City. He continued his journey to Green Street but the Court having adjourned he returned home having in the meantime visited a Picture House in Grafton Street. He again left 37 Haddington Road at 8.15 p.m. and walked via Stephens Green to the Royal Exchange Hotel where he remained a few minutes. He returned to his lodgings at 10.15 p.m. and was not again seen out for the night.
