Subject, MOVEMENTS OF DUBLIN EXTREMISTS.

I beg to report that on the 7th inst. the undermentioned extremists were observed moving about and associating with each other as follows:-

With Thomas J. Clarke, 75 Parnell Street, Major John McBride for close on an hour from 8.40 p.m.; P. Ryan for half an hour between 9 and 10 p.m.

Major John McBride, E. Kent, P. Beasley, J. McGuinness, M. J. Pender, John T. Kelly, T.C., B. J. Fagan, Richard O'Carroll, T.C., James Whelan, J. J. Walsh, D. McCarthy, Michael Lynch, and Mrs. Sheehy Skeffington at Green Street Courthouse during the trial of O'Hegarty and Bolger. O'Hegarty was acquitted and both accused were put back until ~~next~~ Commission in August next.

J. J. Walsh left 37 Haddington Road at 9.30 a.m. and proceeded to some of the Auction Rooms on Bachelors Walk. He was afterwards in Green Street Courthouse during the trial of O'Hegarty. He left in company with D. McCarthy but on parting with the latter in Mary Street Walsh went direct to the shop, 20 Blessington Street, where he remained for a few minutes.
