Justice of the Peace.

Note.—This Declaration should be made before a Justice of the Peace, but not at Petty Sessions. It is exempt from Stamp Duty under 64 & 65 Vic., cap. 39.

Sec. 3.—The governor, master, or chief resident officer of every prison, barrack, hospital, or lunatic asylum, and of every public or charitable institution, be determined upon by the Lord Lieutenant, shall act as and be the inmates thereof, and shall conform to such instructions as may be issued by the authority of the Lord Lieutenant for obtaining the returns required by this Act, may be practicable, with respect to such inmates, but the initials of the Christian names and Surnames of such inmates shall be stated in an

Sec. 7 (3).—If any person employed in taking the Census of the population, or any other person, shall be guilty of any breach of official trust within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act, 1901, he shall be liable accordingly.
