COMMERCIAL CLERK, COMMERCIAL TRAVELLER, SHOPMAN—always to add in what branch of business.
14. In TRADES, MANUFACTURES, or other Business, Masters should, in all cases, be distinguished.—Example: "Carpenter—Master."
15. WORKERS in MANUFACTURES, and generally in the Mechanical Arts, should distinctly state the particular BRANCH or WORK, to which they are attached. Where the Trade is much sub-divided, both the MATERIAL, and the nature of the work, should be stated.—Example: "Watchmaker—Compositor." Where the description of Mine in which they are employed is of importance, it should be stated.—Example: "Copper Miner, Engineers, to be
