MINERS, should be distinguished by the name of the mine in which they are employed, and the name of the mine should be written in the column headed "Where Born."

WOMEN, should be distinguished by the name of the mill in which they are employed, and the name of the mill should be written in the column headed "Where Born."

TRADESMEN, should be distinguished by the name of the trade in which they are employed, and the name of the trade should be written in the column headed "Where Born."

AGRICULTURAL LABOURERS, should be distinguished by the name of the farm in which they are employed, and the name of the farm should be written in the column headed "Where Born."

DOMESTIC SERVANTS, should be distinguished by the name of the house in which they are employed, and the name of the house should be written in the column headed "Where Born."

SEAFARERS, should be distinguished by the name of the vessel in which they are employed, and the name of the vessel should be written in the column headed "Where Born."

TRAVELLERS, should be distinguished by the name of the place to which they are travelling, and the name of the place should be written in the column headed "Where Born."

PERSONS ABSENT ON THE NIGHT OF SUNDAY, MARCH 31st, 1901, should be distinguished by the name of the place to which they are absent, and the name of the place should be written in the column headed "Where Born."

PERSONS ABSENT AT WORK OR TRAVELLING, &c., DURING THAT NIGHT, AND WHO RETURN HOME ON MONDAY, APRIL 1st, should be distinguished by the name of the place to which they are absent, and the name of the place should be written in the column headed "Where Born."
