Sec. 3.—The Governor, master, or chief resident-officer of every prison, workhouse, barrack, hospital, or other place, and every public officer, clerk, or inmate, in which may be determined by the Lord Lieutenant, shall act as and be the enumerator of the inmates thereof, and shall conform to such instructions as may be sent to him by the authority of the Lord Lieutenant for obtaining the returns required by this Act, so far as may be practicable, with respect to such inmates, but the initial letters only of the Christian names and surnames of such inmates shall be stated in any such returns.

Sec. 7 (3).—If any person employed in taking the Census communicates, without lawful authority, acquired in the course of his employment he shall be guilty of a breach of official secrecy, and if he is a member of the G. O. C., he shall be liable to be punished in the manner provided in the Official Secrets Act, 1889, and that Act shall apply accordingly.
