Sec. 3.—The governor, master, or chief resident-officer of every prison, workhouse, barracks, hospital, or lunatic asylum, and of every charitable institution which may be determined upon by the Lord Lieutenant, shall act as and be the Enumerator for the purposes of this Act, and shall obtain the instructions as may be sent to him by the authority of the Lord Lieutenant, and shall but the initial letters only of the Christian names and surnames of such inmates shall be stated in any such return.
Sec. 7 (3).—If any person employed in taking the Census communicates, without lawful authority, any information acquired in the course of his employment to any person other than an official trust within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act, 1889, and that Act shall apply accordingly.
