Note.—This Declaration should be made before a Justice of the Peace, but *not at Petty Sessions*. It is exempt from Stamp Duty under 54 & 55 Vic., cap. 39.

Sec. 3.—The governor, master, or chief resident-owner of every prison, workhouse, barracks, hospital, or lunatic asylum, and of every public or charitable institution which may be determined by the Governor in Council, shall be bound to cause to be made up and returned to the Governor in Council, conform to such instructions as may be sent to him by the authority of the Lord Lieutenant for the purpose of ascertaining the amount of the returns required by this Act so far as may be practicable, with respect to such inmates, and to the persons only of the Christian name and surname of such inmates shall be added in any such return.

Sec. 7 (3).—If any person employed in taking the Census communicates without lawful authority, or in breach of the provisions of the Official Secrets Act, 1889, and that Act shall apply accordingly, with the meaning of the said Act, any information or document so communicated or so transmitted

Sec. 7 (3).—If any person employed in taking the Census communicates, without lawful authority, any information acquired in the course of his employment he shall be guilty of a breach of official trust within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act, 1889, and that Act shall apply accordingly.
