Sec. 3.—The governor, master, or chief resident officer of every prison, workhouse, barrack, hospital, or lunatic asylum, and of every public or charitable institution which may be determined upon by the Lord Lieutenant, shall act as and be the enumerator of the inmates thereof, and shall conform to such instructions as may be sent to him by the authority of the Lord Lieutenant for obtaining the returns required by this Act, so far as may be practicable with respect to such inmates, but the initial letters only of the Christian name and surnames of such inmates shall be stated in any such return.
Sec. 7 (3).—If any person employed in taking the Census communicates, without lawful authority, any information acquired in the course of his employment, he shall be guilty of a breach of official trust within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act, 1889, and that Act shall apply accordingly.

Note.—This Declaration should be made before a Justice of the Peace, but not at Petty Sessions. It is exempt from Stamp Duty under 54 & 55 Vic., cap. 39.
