Subject, MOVEMENTS OF DUBLIN EXTREMISTS.

I beg to report that on the 18th. Inst. the undermentioned extremists were observed moving about and associating with each other as follows:-

Thomas J. Clarke resumed work in his shop 75, Parnell St. at 12 noon. Those seen in conversation with him afterwards included C. Colbert for a quarter of an hour between 12 & 1 p. m. Jeremiah C. Lynch and P. Beasley for half an hour between 7 & 8 p.m. John T. Kelly, T.C., and William O'Leary Curtis for twenty minutes from 8-45 p. m.

F. Sheehy-Skeffington left Amiens St. by 9 a.m. train en route to Belfast. He returned to Dublin by 9 p. m. train. R.I.C. informed.
