Subject, MOVEMENTS OF DUBLIN EXTREMISTS.

I beg to report that on the 17th. Inst.,  
the undermentioned extremists were observed  
moving about and associating with each other  
as follows:-

75, Parnell Street yesterday. Those who  
called there during the day included E. Daly,  
F. Fahy and Thomas McCarthy. The injury to  
Clarke's arm, which is said to have been  
caused by the accidental discharge of a Rev-  
olver, is not yet quite healed.
