My Committee are very anxious to have amendments made to the proposed Constitution which would enable them to support it.

We gather that you are prepared to modify the Sections dealing with strictly political issues in such a way as to secure equal political rights for women. But my Committee are very particularly concerned with Sections affecting the economic position of women. You will agree that they are rightly so concerned as these Sections affect workingclass women only.
